Want to take the message a little further? Get together with a group of friends, co-workers or family and talk about the message! These questions will help you dive into the word as you grow in community with others.

Simply watch the message, get together with a group of people, and read the questions. If you're feeling really crazy, try praying before and after you meet. God will be there with you!

- 1 Father's Day was this past Sunday. What is your biggest dad fail or what is your dad's biggest dad fail?
- 2 Read Matthew 7:24-27 together. What parts of this passage stand out to you? What challenges you? What questions do you still have?
- 3 In order to follow Jesus, we need to listen to his words. Adam said, "What Jesus shares is so unexplainable that the wise don't fully understand it, and yet it's so basic that a child can." What does that statement mean to you? How could you become like a child to hear Jesus more clearly?
- 4 Adam shared, "Don't say Jesus isn't speaking to you if your Bible is closed." How did this statement challenge you? How has this been true for you?
- 5 In order to follow Jesus, we need to practice his words. Why would listening to Jesus' words and not practicing them be so destructive? How have you done this before?
- 6 How would listening to and practicing Jesus' words prepare us for the storms that life brings? Share about a storm in your life. Did listening to and practicing Jesus' words have an impact on that storm? Was there a storm you endured where you didn't listen to and practice Jesus' words?
- 7 What has Jesus said to you that you haven't acted on yet?
